

CAMP INFORMATION 2010

DATES

There are two two-week sessions in 2010:

- Saturday 17th July - Friday 30th July, and
- Saturday 31st July - Friday 13th August.

If you would like to register your child for four weeks please tick both sessions on the booking form.

There is one one-week session in 2010:

- Friday 6th August - Friday 13th August

PRICES

The price per two week session is £1540 or €1800 or CHF2900.

The price per one week session is £800 or €900 or CHF1500.

HOW TO BOOK

Visit www.campsuisse.com to register online or to download a printable booking form (pdf). Paper forms can be returned to us by fax, post or email.

PAYMENT

A non-refundable deposit of £500 or €750 or 1000 CHF is due with each completed booking form. This may be in the form of a cheque made payable to 'International Camp Suisse' or a bank transfer. Please email us with dates of the session(s) on which you wish to enrol your child and we will supply the relevant bank details. If you make an international bank transfer you will incur fees. Please mark 'OUR' (sender pay fees) in the fees section of the transfer document to ensure that you avoid underpaying.

TRANSFERS

Free escorted transfers are provided from and to either: Geneva airport, Geneva train station, or Aigle train station, in accordance with your requests. Please return your child's completed 'travel arrangements form' to us by post, fax or email by 30 June. If your child is flying unaccompanied to Geneva, preferred arrival times are between 9am and 5pm and preferred departure times are between 10am and 5pm. Please contact us if you are unable to make arrangements that fall within these times.

CONDUCT

It is expected that the conduct of all campers will be exemplary throughout their stay. Any camper whose behaviour or language is considered to be inappropriate will be sent home at the discretion of International Camp Suisse and at the expense of the individual's parents. Smoking and the drinking of alcohol are strictly forbidden for all campers.

KIT

All sporting and safety equipment is provided although campers may bring any personal equipment at their own risk. It is advised that any clothes brought to Camp Suisse are casual, washable, and clearly labelled. It is advised that campers do not bring any valuable items to camp.

WHAT IS INCLUDED

The all-inclusive cost includes: accommodation in rooms of 2 to 4 beds (all with private bathroom, most with balcony or terrace), with full board (3 meals per day including outdoor barbecue evenings) and some drinks; all bedding, linen, and laundering of sheets once a week; all activities, excursions and entertainment; all admissions and cover charges; language tuition as per our program; a selection of the sports mentioned in the brochure; return accompanied escort from airport or train station (as above).

WHAT IS NOT INCLUDED

Any air fares; pocket money for sweets, additional drinks, any shopping excursions or presents etc; costs associated with obtaining relevant travel documentation, including visa or passport fees and any other expenses arising from failure to hold the correct documentation or inability to present it when necessary; accident insurance.

VISAS & TRAVEL DOCUMENTS, EHIC CARD

It is each parent or guardian's responsibility to ensure that their child is in possession of all relevant travel documentation. This includes his or her own passport and visa documentation where necessary. Parents should check with the relevant embassy whether a visa will be required for their child. European campers (only) should be in possession of an EHIC (European Health Insurance Card) where available.

STAFF & SAFETY

International Camp Suisse is owned and operated by Miss Julie Tyler B.A. (Hons) who developed the summer camp program having previously worked with British and international children in the Swiss Alps in the wintertime. Campers are grouped for activities on the basis of their age in groups of four to seven. Group leaders supervise and co-ordinate all activities throughout the day. Instruction and leadership for each activity are provided in addition where necessary by qualified instructors. The health, safety and welfare of our campers are of paramount importance and we insist on the highest possible standards of safety in absolutely all areas of our program. Furthermore, we take all our responsibilities very seriously and for this reason have an excellent safety record. We fully appreciate the concerns of parents when their children are away from home and if you have any questions or concerns regarding safety matters we would be more than happy to discuss them with you. First aid facilities and suitably qualified individuals are available on site, 24 hours a day. In addition, in the event of any medical emergency we have established contact with local doctors, dentists and hospitals, including the nearby specialist children's hospital in Aigle; just 25 minutes away by road.
